As you can see on the other side of this letter I have put **re-membrances** of what took place 35 years ago in our lives...My husband was kidnapped and held 4 days! 3 other Missionaries were held in another place for 33 days! God was merciful, powerful and God answered the prayers of many of His people and my husband was able to escape out of the hand of the enemy before daybreak on the 5 day! **How many of you remember?** We saw our Powerful God at work on our behalf! You dear Ones were with us then- and praying for us and we are SO thankful you **are still** with us....praying and giving so that we can serve Him here!!

The work of **Ethnos360** continues to find openings of service amidst the regulations with Covid! Praise God we have had not one with the virus and we are so grateful! Just yesterday we welcomed here a brand new R-66 Helicopter (flown in from the factory in Torrance CA, by one of our pilots) that was provided through the gifts of God's people and it will be used on the field of Papua New Guinea. To think that just 35 years ago when **Paul was kidnapped, and then escaped**...it was in a Cessna 185-one engine aircraft!!

To bring you up to the present...As yet, the doors of the prisons here in our area have not reopened where we have worked and shared the Word of God. All is ready to go though, when the time comes! - New ID passes have been received- all our required paperwork is completed and turned in, including our TB tests. So we wait... But... God is giving us openings to former inmates who have contacted us, asking for prayer, thanking us for the part we've had in their lives. One, who is part of a church in Yuma has since married and has a lil one, wants to visit us so his family can get to know us too.(We shall have to see if that is allowed in all the rules given us as Volunteers : (One couple), the husband who was in our local prison, has been sending us gifts for awhile now. Another former inmate, whom we haven't seen in years, sent us money (out of the blue) thru our Mission! What a pleasant, heart-warming surprise for us! It has encouraged us to know we aren't forgotten : **but remembered!**

The end of this month **Paul will celebrate his -80th- birthday** and so we **continue to remember the past** where we saw God's faithfulness and rejoice in the present and looking forward to the future when the Lord will come and take His children home! Life has been good, in spite of the Covid! We've seen some of our kids and talk by phone with our family far away. We've gotten to see some of our grandkids as well! **All Glory to God!!**
