

Sobega Water Project

One of our support centers, Sobega, is looking to upgrade their water system as many of the major components have exceeded their expected lifespan and are no longer effective. The well water at Sobega features a high level of iron and manganese in the water, which increases the risks of several illnesses. In addition, it places unnecessary wear on plumbing, appliances, and filters. An upgraded system will provide clean drinking water and reduce ongoing maintenance while increasing volume/pressure by 300%.

A new water system is expected to increase longevity of our missionaries and improve the quality of life on our centers. This project also benefits our local neighbors as several water taps are provided to the community.
