The earlier phrase, "Scripture in Use" has morphed into "Scripture Engagement," stimulating people to go beyond reading to actually engaging with the Scriptures in their language. SE has become a significant focus at GIAL and the movement of evangelical missions around the world.

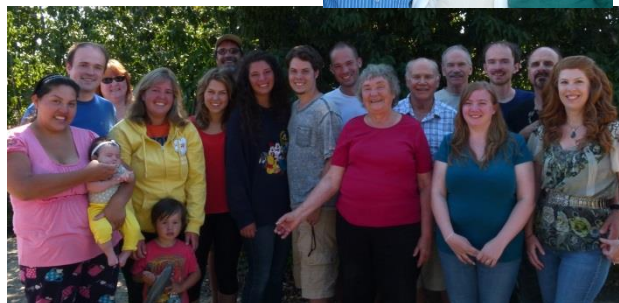
Highlights of 2012
