Cheryl came to the Rescue Mission in July struggling with alcoholism and PTSD caused by a traumatic childhood and exacerbated by several abusive relationships.

After five hospital stays in six months, she became depressed and pushed her family and friends away. She moved back to Michigan to be near her father and ended up in an abusive relationship. She left that situation and headed toward Tawas on foot.

A kind gentleman picked her up and offered her a ride to Standish. She apprehensively accepted and was glad she did. The man spoke about God and his love for his family. He even gave her cash for food and dropped her off at the bus station.

Cheryl wanted to get to a shelter, but the bus didn't leave for 24 hours. She spent the day on the steps of a church and slept in a building under construction. She googled homeless shelters and thought Saginaw was her best option.

"I feel safe here," Cheryl says, and she is most pleased with her relationship with God. Her favorite thing is chapel. She is determined to restore her relationships with her family, especially her daughter. She also wants to complete the SAVE Program, find a job and get her own place.
