Based on the CAT scans taken, the Doctor recommends that I go ahead and get radiation on the rather large mass in my throat. It is larger than a golf ball and affecting my voice and causing some low level of pain at times. We have decided to hold off beginning the 12 treatments until after our granddaughter Briana's wedding on June 8th. So, on June 10th I'll start these treatments. They are going to use a low dose of radiation...which they expect to have minimal side effects. I have no other lymph nodes that are concerning my Doctor at this time, for which I am thankful and I will not need any chemo. I will go in for treatments Monday through Friday until I complete the 12 treatments. I am doing fine. The Lord is giving me the peace He has promised and as a result "all is well!" I'm resting in His loving care.

I have just completed the 20 hour module on "Conflict Resolution" with our CP2 (2<sup>nd</sup> term) students. Twenty eight students are graduating on Thursday, so the campus will be very quiet by the weekend as almost all the students will be traveling to their home areas. These students will continue their journeys of raising support and building a team around them before launching out onto the mission field. Which reminds me of you and the wonderful team God has provided for us throughout our 48 years! How blessed we are! What a faithful team you are and we love to tell the students just starting out about the wonderful faithfulness of God! This is what will carry us through these uncertain days.
