

Study Questions (In no particular order)

Read Acts 18

- Just as details can somehow pass us by in life without us noticing, what details in this passage stand out to you that you might be tempted to cast off as unimportant?
- When we consider the details of our own lives, how do we differentiate between those life experiences that are chance encounters and those that are divinely appointed? Is there a differentiation to be made at all?
- When thinking about Paul's relationship with Aquila and Priscilla, how might that relationship look similar to relationships that we have in our lives today?
- We often times compartmentalize our relationships (i.e. family, employment, church, extracurricular). In what ways can we do a better job of letting the fact that we are Christians infuse itself into all the various compartments we might have?
- How can we as Christians today take comfort in the promise that God made to Paul in v. 9-10?
- We are told that God ordains the governmental authorities that we live under. Are we comfortable with the idea that God sometimes (most of the time in the Bible) institutes authorities that are not God-fearing men in order to use them to further his plans on earth?
- How does the simplicity of the message that the "Christ was Jesus" make our responsibility to share the gospel easier, and/or how does it make it more complicated with particular audiences?
