

Review from Sunday's Message for Personal Meditation:

- i. Message points for meditation:
 - a. Psalms 19:1-6. **The skies declare God's glory.**
 - i. Those inanimate objects in the sky are speaking - declaring God's glory in every language, to the ends of the earth, holding the world accountable to the Creator.
 - ii. We gather to proclaim the mighty works of God in worship. The heavens *are* the mighty work of God.
 - b. Psalms 19:7-11. **The Scriptures declare God's glory.**
 - i. Not only does Creation speak – but God speaks! God declares the glory of God in what He communicates in His Word.
 - ii. The Scripture is more desirable than wealth and dessert (honey).
 - c. Psalm 19:12-14. If we are going to bring God glory (*like the skies; like the Scripture*) then we are going to need God's grace! **The Savior is God's glory.**
 - i. Jesus forgives, delivers from evil, and redeems.
 - ii. David understands that God is: Creator (v.1-6), Revealer (v.7-11) and Redeemer (v.12-14)!
 - iii. There is no bringing God glory apart from experiencing His salvation through faith in His Son!

Questions for Reflection, Application and Fellowship:

- i. While you may not be an astute observer of the skies and sun, what aspect of God's creation most resonates with you and communicates to you God's glory? What part of God's creation inspires your worship?
- ii. David said that God's instructions were more desirable than gold (wealth) and honey (sweets). How does the Scripture demonstrate a practical place of priority in your life?
- iii. How do you respond to the statement made in Sunday's message: "I have been saved...I am being saved...I will be saved" ?

(Consider the following verses: Romans 3:21-26; Colossians 2:6-7; Galatians 3:3; 5:1-5; 1 Peter 1:3-9; Hebrews 10:14)
