## Immanuel Bible Church Quarterly Church Business Meeting

Wednesday, October 24, 2018

Pastor Alex read from I Corinthians 13. He shared that love should be encapsulating in everything we do towards one another. The meeting was opened in prayer at 6:59p.m.
- III. Establishment of Quorum**

There were 74 members present at the time of establishing a *quorum*. *Quorum needed* for regular business is 51 members and *quorum* for constitutional amendments requires 68 to be present.

# Financial Report

## Administration Team Reports

---

### **BENEVOLENCE** submitted by Ken Streeter

The Benevolence Committee has been responsive to needs of the congregation, as they have become known during the year. Communion offerings have made it possible to provide assistance with Church family needs and camperships.

The composition of the Benevolence Committee is now Ken Streeter-chair, Dr. Mike Gebler, Linda Drude, Brooke Hazen, Tom Peck and Phil Luter. We all remain attentive to needs that become known to us, and we continue to encourage the congregation to direct knowledge of need our way. The Mission of the Benevolence Committee is: "To glorify God by following principles of scripture to share the charitable interests of the church with those in need."

We have not completed the year-end financial report due to the close deadline for submission of this report, and the fact that our December bank statement has not yet been received. Books were completely balanced at the end of November and year end totals will be included in the first quarter report. I can tell you that we shared \$11,435.00 to meet benevolence needs within the congregation, and additionally we shared \$751 to assist campers. Our benevolence expenditures included funds to assist members with car repairs, health insurance, medical bills, property taxes, rent and utilities, and Christmas gifts for widows, seniors, and families facing financial challenges.

This year your committee also provided Christian camping assistance as part of our on-going ministry. Families interested in sending multiple children to Camp Barakel may wish to complete a camp scholarship application to offset the cost of camp.

Finally, let me remind you once again that the Benevolence Committee does their best work as you help make us aware of congregational needs. Additionally, there seems to be interest in helping members with home repairs. Benevolence committee members could be an avenue of channeling such requests, and the fund can also be used to help with the cost of these repairs. Please contact any member of the committee as you become aware of such needs.

### **BUILDING AND GROUNDS** submitted by Peter Kunz

As the building addition is complete, there are just a few outside items that are planned for this Spring. The largest project is to remove the temporary drive, bring in some topsoil, and plant grass. If there is enough interest from volunteers, we will plant the grass ourselves. There are 4 flat

screen TV's available on carts for use in the classrooms. It is yet to be decided what audio and visual equipment is needed for the large room; we will understand it better as the room is used. The cabinets and counter top for the large room and children's check-in station are complete and ready for use.

Demolition has begun to remove the old classrooms. The major source of dust has been from removing the cellulose wall insulation; once this has been cleaned up there should be much less dust. Work is progressing as expected.

Consumers Energy installed 11 new thermostats in the old part of our facility. They provided them for free as part of their energy saving effort.

## **CHRISTIAN EDUCATION**

### ***Children's Ministries (Sunday AM)*** submitted by Michelle Byrne

Children's Church has, like the rest of the church, gone through significant change over the last quarter. We have implemented a new curriculum in the preschool, prek-kindergarten, and 1st and 2nd grade classes. The curriculum being utilized is the Praise Factory Curriculum. We have teams of teachers which are committed to teaching two weeks per month, which has helped with consistency in the classrooms. Beginning in December, we are planning to have the fifth Sundays of the month marked as family Sundays, which means that our children from Prek-5th grade will be participating with the congregation for the entire service on those Sundays. Giving our children tastes of our worship service, in its entirety, will aid us in accomplishing our goal of preparing our young people to participate fully in the life of the church. - Pastor Matt and Amber teach the high school students (9-12 grades) on Sunday nights and lead high school discipleship groups on Wednesday evenings at their home.
- David and Jessie Mullet teach the middle school students (6-8 grades) on Sunday nights.

- Over the past several months, the middle school and high school students have served in a variety of ways, including serving at Community Village for the residents' Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners and raking yards for people in need within our church family. Both groups enjoyed Christmas parties, as well as an after-raking party, and the high schoolers had a life-size Clue party to begin the fall semester.
- We have a group of 39 going to Camp Barakel for Winter Retreat February 1-3.
- Parents of high school students will meet at Pastor Matt and Amber's home on January 25 for an evening of encouragement and prayer. We anticipate a great time to come together and pray for our students.
- Pray that Christ may dwell in the hearts of our students through faith, and that they will comprehend the breadth and length and height and depth of the love of Christ.

***Nursery Ministry (Sunday AM and PM)*** submitted by Megan Boese

The church nursery continues to grow, and I am thankful for each and every one of our volunteers! We are thoroughly enjoying our new rooms in the new facility. We provide nursery during the 9:00 A.M. service, 10:30 A.M. service, and 5:00 P.M. classes. Recently, we added a toddler nursery during the 10:30 A.M. service. This classroom is for children from two to three years of age. During this time, the caregivers share short lessons with our toddlers from *Everything a Child Should Know About God* by Kenneth Taylor. It takes a minimum of 12 volunteers to staff the nursery each week. That means I need around 50 people every month! I'm always in need of more people to serve. If you are interested in working with our little ones, please let me know! This ministry is a blessing to many families.

**ELDERS** submitted by Pastor Mark Hazen

During the fourth quarter of 2018, a membership class was conducted with numerous individuals completing the course and applying for membership. The class, along with thirteen membership interviews, was conducted by the Elders. The membership vote on these applicants will take place during the January, 2019, Member Meeting.

The preaching ministry consisted of an 11-week series through the book of Ecclesiastes, entitled *Wisdom under the Sun*. The Ecclesiastes series was followed by a three-week series on *the Messiah*, taken from the Gospel of Mark and Luke. The preaching ministry planned for the first quarter of 2019 is entitled *Come and See*. This is scheduled to be a 16-week study through the Gospel of John.

The construction on the new facility addition was completed in the fourth quarter. This ministry tool is already improving our opportunities and abilities to minister effectively to our IBC family. The demolition, renovation and construction of the auditorium was planned during the fourth quarter, and is scheduled to take place during the first quarter of 2019. Anticipated completion to be in April.

The Elders regularly meet to pray and provide oversight to the ministry here at Immanuel Bible Church (IBC). The Elder's continue to work with the Servant Administration team in overseeing and

administering the ministry. The growing membership necessitates the need for additional Elders. Elder training and adding Elder protégés is the anticipation for 2019.

We appreciate the prayer and support that is regularly expressed toward the Elder Team.
